

Report For Quedgeley Parish Council, 20th April 2009.

Figures for this report have been taken from Police Management Information System (MIS).

They are accurate as of Monday 20th April 2009, 1900hrs.

February saw just 43 calls over the course of the month relating to all public disorder.

March had 57 calls to police relating to disorder.

In February 2009, just 42 crimes were recorded by police, 18 of which were in the Kingsway estate.

March had 57 crimes, 15 of which were in the Kingsway estate.

- Of these 57 crimes, 12 involved damage to or theft from vehicles.
- Of these 57 crimes, 12 were burglaries to peoples homes or businesses.
- Currently, 12 have been detected. However, this number will rise with time.

Other Issues:

The Kingsway POD continues to take hard work and determination from those of us wanting it to happen. Myself, Sheila GOLDER from Equals Youth club and Jackie Hall, Councillor for children's issues met with QUVL agent Andy HUNTER to discuss siting of the POD. As a temporary measure for the youth of the estate, to give them somewhere of there own, somewhere to go, until QUVL build a youth centre it would be a fantastic facility for them. It is with great disappointment I see this facility being used in political wrangling over planning permissions. The teenagers of the estate will have to wait yet longer for their facility, more hanging around in Aldi car park to come!

I have raised the possibility of a Quedgeley & Hardwicke Pubwatch scheme, to run as a satellite or smaller scheme to that one being run in the city. I have found approval from some landlords, and found one willing to host the meetings. I'm working on this in the near future, in order to bring down incidences of ASB on our area.

Large crime series of damage to vehicles happening in the area. May have seen this in the local press. Police work hard to identify and detect these offences, and will be deploying considerable effort in the near future to put this to an end.
