

Report For Quedgeley Parish Council, 16th November 2009.

Figures for this report have been taken from Police Management Information System (MIS). They are accurate as of Monday 16th November 2009, 1300hrs.

There were 48 ASB incidents recorded by the police in the month of October 2009. The range of these incidents is from children 'cherry knocking', to men threatening to throw bricks through windows.
20 of these 48 incidents were on the Kingsway estate.

Over the month of October there were 37 crimes reported to police, which took place in Quedgeley. 10 of these 37 crimes were on the Kingsway estate.

They break down as follows.

- No dwelling burglaries
- 5 Non-dwelling burglaries
- 2 Theft of Motor Vehicles
- 7 Theft From Motor Vehicles
- 5 Criminal Damages
- 3 offences of Violence Against the Person

Other issues:

No serious crime on the beat again.

There was a burglary at the post office in the martins newsagents next to Tesco's. It has all the marks of being carried out by a professional criminal. Without giving details away, police would encourage anyone with information or suspicions about this crime to come forward and be treated in confidence, or by contacting the Crimestoppers (0800 555 111) hotline to report information anonymously.

Hallow'een and Guy Fawkes appear to have passed without major incident.

PC Sam JONES will be joining the Safer Community Team At Quedgeley police Station from January 2010. He will have specific responsibility for the Kingsway Village. This addition is to reflect the increasing population of the Kingsway.

I haven't yet received an update from Councillor Vic Rice in terms of the Community Walkabout in the Kingsway Village in July 2009. No update either from Alastair JEWELL of the builders consortium QUVL.
