Report For Quedgeley Parish Council, 17th May 2010.

Figures for this report have been taken from Police Management Information System (MIS). They are accurate as of Monday 17th May 2010, 0900hrs.

April saw just 93 calls over the course of the month relating to all public disorder. 24 of these calls were in the Kingsway Village.

In April 2010, there were 83 crimes were recorded by police, 15 of which were in the Kingsway estate.

Across the police station area, crime is down 36% from the same period last year, $01 \text{ April} - 10^{\text{th}} \text{ May}$.

Other issues:

The Kingsway POD is now in place, looking splendid in its new coat of blue paint. A press release will be done later in the month, once the site is up and running.

The Yr 11 pupils left school for the last time, except their exams, on Friday 14th May. Traditionally, this night each year has seen a huge increase in the amount of petty crime, and rowdy behaviour. This year was managed significantly better, with no noticeable difference in the crime or call figures to police.

Officers guided the youths who wished to gather to the Dimore2 playing field, removed alcohol wherever it was seen. All youths were removed from the field by 2200hrs. The City council were warned a while back of the litter problem this event causes.

I'm sure we wish them all well in the forthcoming exams.
